17. Description of Historic Place

The Clarke Residence is a Victorian style, one and one-half storey, L-shaped house with a cross gable roof and covered verandah. It is situated in the Woodlea residential neighbourhood, north of downtown Red Deer.

18. Heritage Value of Historic Place

Heritage Value

The Clarke Residence is significant as the home of Hugh Clarke, a prominent building contractor who was responsible for the construction of numerous early public buildings and residences in Red Deer. The house is also significant for its association with Hugh's wife, Gertrude Gaetz, a member of Red Deer's founding family. The Clarke Residence has historical value as part of the former "Son-in-law Row," the name given to properties on 56 Street that were wedding gifts from the Reverend Dr. Leonard Gaetz to his children. Hugh and Gertrude Clarke resided in the home until 1920.

Architectural Value

The Clarke Residence, built sometime between 1910 and 1912, is one of the best remaining examples of a Victorian style home in Red Deer.

- Victorian style form and massing including: the steep feature gable over the front entry with larger front and side gables, decorative sunburst pattern fret work in the gable peaks, idiosyncratic false dormer over the front entry steps, and sandstone foundation
- Original window pattern and cantilevered bay window projection on west and east elevation
- Location on "Son-in-law Row" (56 Street)
