PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: March is Amyloidosis Awareness Month, a time to raise awareness, support research, and stand with those living with amyloidosis and their families; and

WHEREAS: Amyloidosis is a group of rare diseases caused by an abnormal protein called amyloid, which can build up in organs and tissues and, if untreated, may lead to organ failure; and

WHEREAS: The symptoms of amyloidosis can resemble more common health conditions, which can make the disease difficult to diagnose; and

WHEREAS: Signs of amyloidosis can include fatigue, shortness of breath, weight loss, swelling in the legs or ankles, numbness in the hands or feet, foamy urine, carpal tunnel syndrome, bruising around the eyes, and an enlarged tongue; and

WHEREAS: Early diagnosis and treatment can improve outcomes for patients and their families; and

WHEREAS: Raising awareness about all forms of amyloidosis, including hereditary and non-hereditary types, helps build healthier communities across Canada;
