PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS the “Day of Mourning,” first officially recognized by the federal government in 1991, is a time for employers, workers, families, and communities to come together to remember those who have lost their lives, been injured, or suffered from work-related incidents or occupational diseases; and

WHEREAS preventing workplace deaths, injuries, and illnesses requires a collective commitment to creating and maintaining safe and healthy work environments; and

WHEREAS the “Day of Mourning” provides an opportunity to renew our shared responsibility to improve workplace safety and prevent work-related illnesses, injuries, and fatalities; and

WHEREAS April 28, 2026 is recognized as the “Day of Mourning” in Red Deer by the Alberta Construction Safety Association's Parkland Regional Safety Committee, Manufacturer's Health and Safety Association, the Red Deer Construction Association, Energy Safety Canada and Red Deer Polytechnic.

NOW THEREFORE

I, Cindy Jefferies, Mayor of The City of Red Deer, do hereby encourage all Red Deerians to take this opportunity to remember those who have lost their lives, been injured, or suffered due to work-related incidents, and to reaffirm their commitment to workplace safety in honour of this day of remembrance.
