

These hardy species generally grow well in the Red Deer area and can be expected to bear fruit from year to year. Red Deer is part of planting zones 3A and 3B.

 (Patterson Pride, Pembina, Brookgold, Green
 Elf, Ivanofka, Ptitisn #3 or #5, Brook Red and
 Perfection)
- 3. Cherry Plums (Dura, Manor, Sapa, New Oka, Kappa, Zeta, Opata, Beta)
- Apple (Adanac, Norland, Fall Red, September Ruby, Norkent, Goodland, Battleford, Carlos Queen, Westland, Minnesota #447, Haralson, Prairie Sun, Prairie Sensation, Autumn Delight, Misty Rose. Honeycrisp may survive within the city.)
- 5. Crabapples (Rescue, Dolgo, Kerr)
- Pear (David, John, Thomas, Ure, Early Gold)

- 3. Raspberry (Boyne, Festival, Steadfast, Royalty, Red Bounty, Red Mammoth, Honeyqueen)
- Currants (The 'Ben' Series, Buffalo, Black Giant, Black Albol, Red Lake, Honey Red)
- Gooseberry (Pixwell, Hinnonmaeki Red, Welcome, Jahn's Prairie)
- 6. Choke Cherry (Garrington, Pickup's Pride, Shubert)
